Part A: The Lumbar Spine **Online Component Outline**

Process: You will proceed sequentially through each slide and cannot skip ahead in the presentation. You can 'pause' each slide at any time. As you progress through the modules, you can return to any previously viewed slide or module at any time.

You may opt to do your work all at once in one session, or take a break and return at a later time. The presentation will 'remember' the last slide you viewed and you will return automatically to that slide in your next session. (A session is considered the period when you login and when you close the course.)

Suggestion: After taking the interactive pop-up quizzes following each of the five modules might be a natural time to take a break from a session.

Completion Time: The average estimate to allow for completing the entire Part A online component is approximately five hours. We note the "running time" as a guide, which does not take into account pre-test, quizzes, post-test, pausing to review sections in the manual, reflective thinking, and material assimilation.

(For CEU purposes in the USA, to determine the contact hours, or "seat time" in the world of distance learning, we ran beta testing with approximately 75 course attendees from our Canadian branch of the Institute in 2011 for feedback on both the mechanics of the course and content. We took the average time that accounted for the actual "running time" with the consideration for those who would take additional time to work through the quiz activities successfully, and also return to review the wrong answers. Since onset in 2012 in the USA, annual reviews of evaluations continue to find this average time of completion to be commensurate.)
